More than 26 drivers and helpers participated in the workshop other than a number of faculty members of the university. Mr. Anees-Ud-Din, DSP traffic and Inspector, Mr. Basir Ilyas and Inspector Mr. Zubair delivered lectures on the laws and rules of the traffic for timely and safe journey. They appraised the participants on the consequences, advantages and disadvantages of not following the traffic laws and rules. Statistical analysis of various tragedies and deaths arising from the roads with comparison with other modes of journey were presented. It was observed that more than 1.30 million deaths occur in the road accidents every year globally and other 30 to 50 million are injured. At the end of the lectures, questions/answer session was held in which almost all the drivers and helpers participated.
